JESUS & THE FISHERMAN #5 The Basin, The Boast, The Betrayal, and **The Abandonment**

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 1. The Basin - Watch **Out for Hyper-Humility** (John 13:1-9)

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 John 13:1 Now before the Feast of the **Passover, when Jesus knew that his** hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ² During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him,

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ³Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God,

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ⁴rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ⁵Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ⁶He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, do you wash my feet?"

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ⁷Jesus answered him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand."

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ⁸ Peter said to him, "You shall never wash my feet." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no share with me."

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ⁹Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!"

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 2. The Boast - Spiritual **Bragging is the Worst** (John 13:36-38)

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 John 13:36 Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, where are you going?" Jesus answered him, "Where I am going you cannot follow me now, but you will follow afterward."

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ³⁷ Peter said to him, "Lord, why can I not follow you now? I will lay down my life for you."

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ³⁸ Jesus answered, "Will you lay down your life for me? Truly, truly, I say to you, the rooster will not crow till you have denied me three times.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 3. The Betrayal - All **Betrayals Come With a Great Cost** (John 18:15-18, 25-27)

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 John 18:15 Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple. Since that disciple was known to the high priest, he entered with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest,

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ¹⁶ but Peter stood outside at the door. So the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out and spoke to the servant girl who kept watch at the door, and brought Peter in.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ¹⁷The servant girl at the door said to Peter, "You also are not one of this man's disciples, are you?" He said, "I am not."

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ¹⁸ Now the servants and officers had made a charcoal fire, because it was cold, and they were standing and warming themselves. Peter also was with them, standing and warming himself.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ²⁵ Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. So they said to him, "You also are not one of his disciples, are you?" He denied it and said, "I am not."

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ²⁶ One of the servants of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with him?"

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ²⁷ Peter again denied it, and at once a rooster crowed.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 4. The Abandonment - The More You Quit on God, The **Easier It Becomes** (John 19:16-18, 25-27)

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 John 19:16 So he delivered him over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus,

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ¹⁷ and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called The Place of a Skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ¹⁸There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ²⁵ but standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene.

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ²⁶When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!"

Jesus & The Fisherman #5 ²⁷ Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.
