

1. Government Increasingly Hostile to Christians (and Creating Millions of Helpless 'Victims') (Daniel 6:1-5)

Daniel 6:1It pleased Darius to set over the kingdom 120 satraps, to be throughout the whole kingdom;

² and over them three high officials, of whom Daniel was one, to whom these satraps should give account, so that the king might suffer no loss.

³ Then this Daniel became distinguished above all the other high officials and satraps, because an excellent spirit was in him. And the king planned to set him over the whole kingdom.

⁴ Then the high officials and the satraps sought to find a ground for complaint against Daniel with regard to the kingdom, but they could find no ground for complaint or any fault, because he was faithful, and no error or fault was found in

⁵ Then these men said, "We shall not find any ground for complaint against this Daniel unless we find it in connection with the law of his God."

2. Authority Always(!) Begins at Home with Respect for Parents and Discipline (or Else) (1 Peter 5:5; Romans 13:1-5; Proverbs 13:1, 24)

1 Peter 5:5 Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

Romans 13:1Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God.

² Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment.

³ For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval,

⁴ for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer.

EN(COURAGE)MENT IN A CHANGED WORLD #6: GOVERNMENT, AUTHORITY, AND THE LAW ⁵Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience.

Proverbs 13:1A wise son hears his

father's instruction, but a

scoffer does not listen to rebuke.

²⁴ Whoever spares the rod hates his son, but he who loves him is diligent to discipline him.

- 3. The Law Christians Submit (Until It <u>Violates Scriptural</u> Absolutes and Convictions
- (1 Timothy 1:8-10; Proverbs 28:4)

1 Timothy 1:8 Now we know

that the law is good, if one

uses it lawfully,

⁹ understanding this, that the law is not laid down for the just but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and sinners, for the unholy and profane, for those who strike their fathers and mothers, for murderers,

10 the sexually immoral, men who practice homosexuality, enslavers, liars, perjurers, and whatever else is contrary to sound doctrine,

Proverbs 28:4 Those who forsake the law praise the wicked, but those who keep the law strive against them.
